

How to reach Washington D.C.

BY AIR:

Washington, D.C. is easily accessible with three major airports—Reagan National (DCA), Dulles International (IAD), and Baltimore/Washington International (BWI). Together they offer extensive domestic and international flight options, with fast, convenient transportation into the city.

Reagan National (DCA)

- Closest airport to downtown D.C., about 10 minutes by car or Metro
- Served primarily by domestic flights
- Directly connected via the Blue and Yellow Metro lines
- Uber, Lyft and Taxi available onsite

Washington Dulles International Airport (IAD)

- Major international gateway, about 26 miles west of D.C.

- Offers extensive international and domestic flight options
- Connected to downtown via the Silver Line Metro
- Uber, Lyft and Taxi available onsite

Baltimore/Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport (BWI)

- Located about 30–40 minutes from D.C. by car
- Often a good option for affordable flights
- Connected to D.C. via MARC train, Amtrak, and shuttles
- Uber, Lyft and Taxi available onsite

BY TRAIN:

Amtrak—the primary national/intercity rail network in the U.S. that stops at Washington Union Station (D.C.).

MARC Train—a commuter rail service operated by the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA). Its three lines (Penn, Camden, Brunswick) connect areas in Maryland (and some WV) to Washington D.C.

BY CAR:

Enter the Congress venue address (Intercontinental Continental Washington D.C. – The Wharf, 801 Wharf St SW, Washington D.C., 20024) into your mapping software. Valet parking is available onsite for \$75/day. Self-parking is available at The Wharf, visit [here](#) for more information and to make a parking reservation.

WEATHER IN D.C.:

Expect comfortable spring weather, with warm days ideal for sightseeing and outdoor events, cool evenings, and a good chance of intermittent rain or showers. Winds are generally light to moderate. Daytime highs reach the mid-70sF (24-25C), and nighttime lows in the mid-to-upper 50sF (13-15C).






Great Gatsby Gala: Celebrating 60 Years of ICOMIA

Neoclassical mansion is surrounded by century-old linden trees, a walled formal garden and inside adorned with chandeliers, ornate plasterwork ceilings and period furnishings and art collected by Ambassador Laughlin.

Our evening will begin with a cocktail reception in the garden, followed by dinner, and finish with live music and dancing evoking the exuberance and grandeur of the 1920s. Guests are encouraged to step into the jazz age in vintage-inspired cocktail or evening attire.



PRESIDENTIAL ESTATE: **George Washington's Estate and Gardens, Mount Vernon**

Tuesday, May 26 | 10:00a.m.–3:30p.m.

Visit the Mount Vernon property, home of George Washington, first President of the United States and his wife, Martha Dandridge Custis Washington. The historic estate includes not only the Mount Vernon Mansion, George and Martha's home, but also a host of colonial era buildings, beautiful gardens, a working distillery and gristmill, and museum with interactive education center. Tour the mansion and the surrounding service buildings, the interactive education center, and the Washington family museum, where personal effects of George and Martha are on display. Located 15 miles south of Washington, D.C. along the scenic Potomac River, Mount Vernon is a true national treasure to enjoy.



HAUTE HISTORY:

Shopping in Historic Georgetown

Enjoy exploring the history and retail in Washington's most famous neighborhood, Georgetown! Learn how Georgetown got its start as a tobacco port and commercial center in the 18th century, as well as other fun facts on this tour and shopping excursion. Visit the Old Stone House, the oldest standing building in Washington, D.C. located in what is now the heart of Georgetown's shopping district. Then peruse the hundreds of shops, from antique dealers, art studios, unique boutiques, national retailers and more!

THE BEST OF THE SMITHSONIANS: **Must See Smithsonian Museums!**

Discover the best of the best during this in-depth tour of the American History and Air and Space museums within the Smithsonian Institution. It is estimated that there are more than 141 million total objects, works of art and specimens displayed at the various Smithsonian Museums located in the heart of Washington. Experience the evolution of man's determination to take flight at the Air & Space Museum, bask in the glamor American pop-culture or the First Ladies' inaugural gowns at the American History Museum.




Optional Embassy Visits

Washington, D.C. is one of the world's largest diplomatic hubs, and it hosts embassies and foreign missions from most of the world's countries, approximately 185 in total. Embassy Row is one of Washington, D.C.'s most distinctive and elegant areas—a stretch of grand mansions, embassies, and diplomatic residences that reflect more than a century of international presence in the capital.

As your hosts, NMMA would be happy to try and arrange a visit to your country's embassy. Simply check that option as part of your registration and the NMMA team will contact you separately and work to arrange a visit during your time in Washington, D.C..

Even if you do not elect to visit your embassy, please consider walking down Embassy Row as part of your own sightseeing tour. The area is lined with ornate Beaux-Arts, Georgian Revival, and Mediterranean-style mansions built in the late 1800s and early 1900s.


